

# SAVE MONEY BUYING YOUR NEXT EV

New Yorkers are eligible for up to:

with the Drive Clean Rebate

Greater than 200 miles range	\$2,000 OFF
40 to 199 miles range	\$1,000 OFF
Less than 40 miles range	\$500 OFF
Electric cars with MSRP >\$42,000	\$500 OFF

\*The Drive Clean Rebate amount depends on the EPA all-electric range for that car model.

Income Requirements:

If your household's gross adjusted income is up to:

\$150,000 for single filers

\$225,000 for head of household

\$300,000 for joint filers

Vehicle Requirements:

The MSRP of the vehicle is up to:

\$80,000 for Pick-up trucks, SUVs, & Vans

\$55,000 for other vehicles

If your household's gross adjusted income is up to:

\$75,000 for single filers

\$112,500 for head of household

\$150,000 for joint filers

Vehicle Requirements:

At least 2 years old

Under \$25,000

From a dealership

Never been claimed as a used tax credit before

## VEHICLES THAT QUALIFY

NYSERDA keeps an updated list of electric vehicles that qualify for **both the Drive Clean Rebate and the Federal Tax Credit** that you can check at any time.

New York drivers can also browse the full list of [Drive Clean Rebate eligible models](#) and [IRA eligible models](#) to get a comprehensive view of their options for EV savings.

Note: Some qualified manufacturers have yet to submit information on eligible vehicles that meet the current requirements.
